## TRIEC Campus Glossary

Term	Description
<b>Catalogue</b>	The first tier of division within the Campus. This section can contain multiple catalogues for specific locations, departments and/or business units and is essentially a cluster of courses.
<b>Category</b>	Categories are within Catalogues. Categories refer to the breakdown within a Catalogue and can include information such as specific subjects or genres.
<b>Certificates</b>	Certificate is a collection of courses that needs to be complete to receive a specific certificate. Some of the courses can be optional or mandatory.
<b>Class</b>	A class is an instance of a course. An example of class is "Math101". This class takes a start date, end date, location etc.
<b>Course</b>	A course is a template for a class. An example of a course is "Math". A course takes information that is relevant to all classes in that course i.e. name, description, objectives etc.
<b>Learning Object</b>	A learning Object can be course, learning path, certificate etc.
<b>Learning Path</b>	Learning Path is a series of course that must be taken in order get a specific reward.
<b>Offline Class</b>	A class that takes place outside of the system. e.g. workshop
<b>Online classes</b>	A class that takes place inside (Online Class Room) of the system.
<b>SCORM</b>	An enabled learning module. e.g. the e-learning modules
<b>Session</b>	A session is only used for offline classes. A class may be broken into several sessions. e.g. 9am – 10am on Monday, 11am -12pm on Tuesday etc.
<b>URL</b>	A class that takes place outside of the system links the user to a webpage. e.g. video download class
<b>User Profile</b>	A link to the user's profile. This link appears as Guest if a user is not logged in to the system.
